1. Definition of a Club/Team

The World Wide Flora & Fauna (WWFF) program encourages participation from Clubs or Teams.

There is a specific category in the WWFF program for Clubs and Teams.

For a club call sign to be accepted into this category there must be at least four (4) members of that club.

2. Process of registering a Club/Team in WWFF

The process for registering a Club/Team is generally the same as the normal registration process, with some additions.

First up, click on 'Register' on the home page of wwff.co (see screen shot below)....

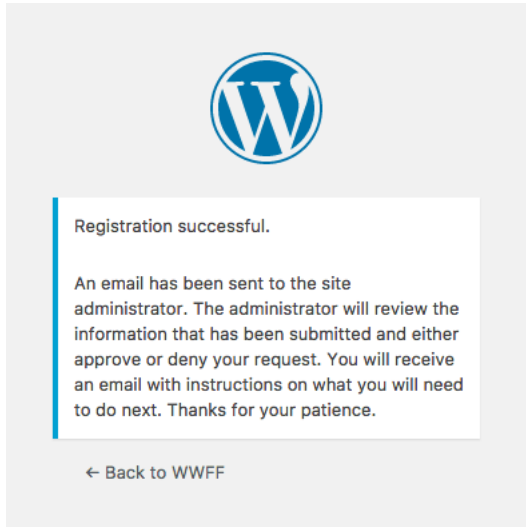

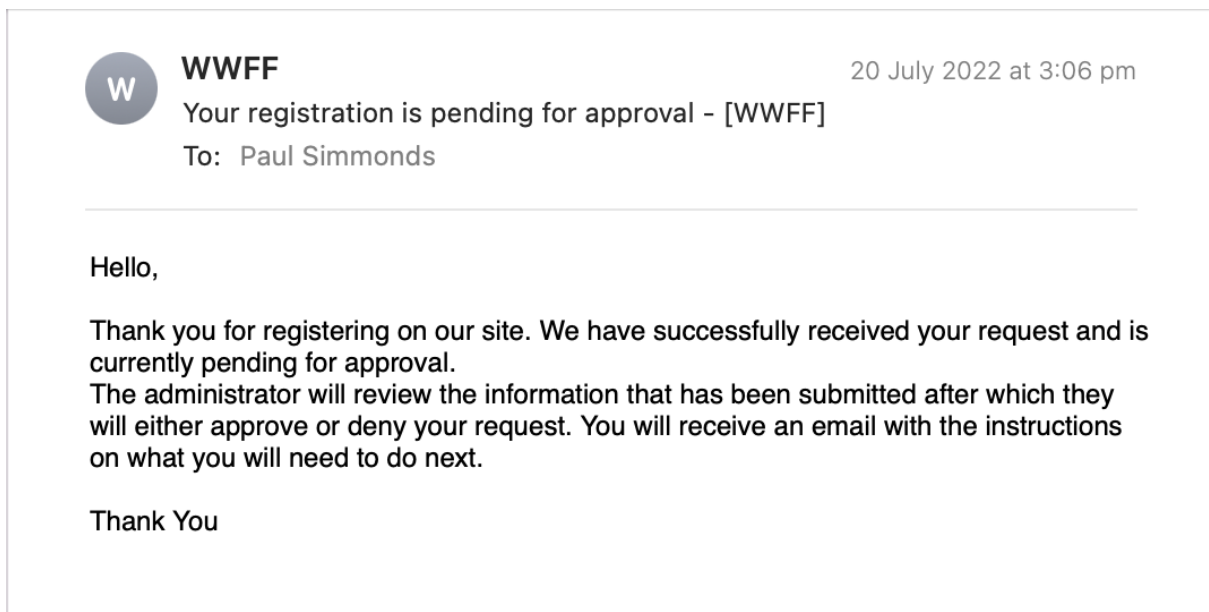

Then click on 'Register'.

If you have registered successfully you will see the screen as shown below.



You will also receive an email from the administrator. See example screen shot below.



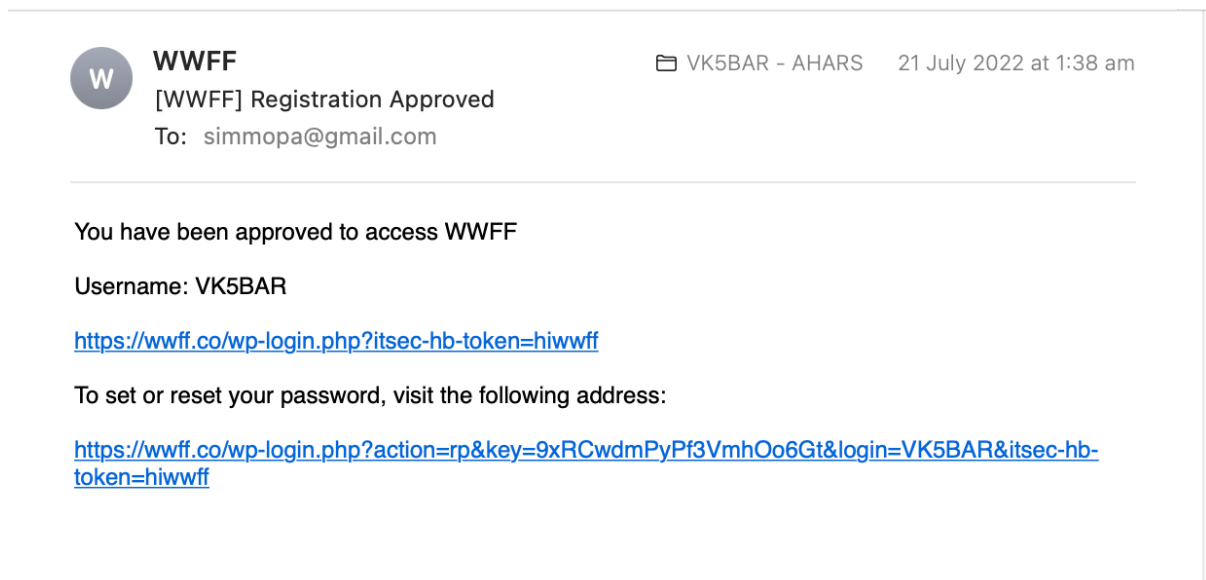
After receiving your account registration, send the request to the VKFF National Co-Ordinator. They will confirm that the call sign is indeed a Club or Team call sign.

The VKFF National Co-Ordinator then sends this information to members@wwff.co.

WWFF Members Services will then apply the club call setting into Logsearch.

Within a short period of time, you will receive another email to advise that you have been approved to access WWFF Logsearch.

You can then log in to Logsearch from the WWFF home page at wwff.co



After clicking on 'Log in', you will be taken to the Log in Screen (as shown below). Type in your call sign and password.

3. How many QSOs are required for a valid Club/Team activation?

A total of 200 QSOs is required for a valid Club/Team activation.

This does not have to be in the one activation. It can be spread out over a period of days, months, etc.

4. Tracking your progress in WWFF Logsearch.

Logsearch is the electronic database for the WWFF program, where all activator logs are uploaded and from where activators and hunters can track their progress in the WWFF program. WWFF awards are also applied for on-line via WWFF Logsearch.

Clubs and Teams also track their progress and apply for awards via Logsearch.

Please do not include your club or team callsign as a 'secondary' callsign in your own personal profile in Logsearch. Please create a separate account as mentioned above for the club/team callsign.

7. ADIF & CSV files

When submitting your ADIF file or CSV file, don't forget to include your own callsign in the Operator field.
